

Mid-drives (Bosch, Fazua, Specialized SL, TQ) give the most natural hill support and weight balance; modern hub systems (KMC, Bafang, SpinTech) keep costs and maintenance low while remaining impressively smooth with torque sensing. For range, ~360-540Wh covers most


